Project: Diorama Shoebox Book Report

Assignment:

Design a shoebox diorama related to the book you have chosen from either from the Suggested Summer REading Book List or an age appropriate book of your choice.

Materials Needed:

- Adult size shoebox or similar sized box
- Wrapping Paper
- Paint
- Construction Paper
- Glue
- Scissors
- 3-D Items (ex: craft sticks may be used to build a fence)
- 4x6 index cards
- Markers
- Black Ink Pen

What is a Diorama?

A diorama is a three-dimensional model representing an important scene from your book. It has a background and uses three-dimensional figures. Pinterest has many great examples.

Directions:

- 1. Cover the outside of your box with wrapping paper or construction paper
- 2. Write all of your information neatly on 4x6 index cards in black ink, then glue them to the proper sides of the box.
 - a. THE INSIDE OF THE BOX Should be decorated like a mini museum exhibit to depict an important scene from your book.
 - b. THE TOP OF THE BOX Include the title of your book, the author's name, book genre, number of pages in the book, and your first and last name.
 - c. THE LEFT SIDE OF THE BOX List and describe the main characters of this book. List three adjectives and 2-3 sentences for each main character.
 - d. THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE BOX Describe the setting of the story. Tell where and when the story takes place. Also describe the scene inside of your box.

- e. THE BACK OF THE BOX Write a short summary of the story. You should have important events from the beginning, middle, and end. Include the main conflict/problem and its solution.
- f. THE BOTTOM OF THE BOX Who was your favorite character? Why? Would you recommend this book to other students? How many starts would you give this book with four being the best and one being the worst? Why?
